CANINE PARTNER REGISTRATION

If your Canine Partner is not yet registered with AKC, simply fill out the Canine Partners Enrollment Application located at the end of this premium list and turn it in along with your entry form and fees (Payment is made directly to AKC. Fill out the credit charge authorization on the Canine Partners form or include a separate check for \$19 payable to AKC).

INSPECTIONS

Each dog will be inspected during Check-in by the inspection committee for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. All dogs to be inspected must be presented WITHOUT TAPE, BANDAGES, or WRAPPING/COVERINGS of any kind. (Coats, blankets, etc.) If, in the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or in season, they shall not be allowed to test, and the applicable entry fees shall be refunded.

ALL DOGS MUST BE INSPECTED BEFORE EACH RUN.

RUNNING YOUR DOG

It is recommended that dogs be handled with a "slip-lead" that gives instantaneous freedom to the dog when the "Tallyho" (release) signal is called by the Huntmaster. The Host Club will have slip leads for you to borrow. Please ask.

Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, or collars with prongs or electronic training collars. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up on something during the run. Owners should be aware that tags hanging from the collar could be required to be removed to help prevent them from being entangled on something during the run.

Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog regarding the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.

Please be aware the HuntMaster has control of the course, they may ask you to remove any non-flat collars, restrictive collars or tags. They will also ask you to secure any handles for safety reasons.

CAT – Summary Description

CAT is an outdoor pass/fail event open to all dogs. CAT is based on the fundamentals of the sport of Lure Coursing where two different sized courses, 300 yards or 600 yards are used depending on a dog's height. Dogs run singly and are required to complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within a maximum amount of time. Sighthounds exposed to CAT may use their experience as an introduction to Lure Coursing tests and trials.

How Does CAT Work?

Coursing Ability Test, tests a dog's ability to traverse a basic course while following a lure. Dogs are required to complete their course with enthusiasm and without interruption within a maximum amount of time. The Coursing Ability Test was developed based on the AKC Lure Coursing program and is a pass/fail event. Titles are awarded based on the accumulation of passes. CAT tests are held outdoors and are open to any breed or mixed breed dog. The course will be designed with safety for non-sighthound breeds as a primary consideration. There shall be no turns more acute than 90 degrees. The total length of the course shall be no less than 600 yards and should be as close to 600 yards as is possible. The lure will consist of 2 - 3 white plastic bags. Depending on the size and type of dog, the dog will run either the full course or a 300-yard course. The 300-yard distance shall be clearly marked. Safety is of utmost importance. Many of the dogs running the Coursing Ability Test will not possess the agility of a sighthound and this must be a consideration in the design of a course.

The speed and distance of the run required will depend on the size and type of dog.

- Dogs under 12" at the withers and/or brachycephalic ("flat-faced") = approx. 300 yards in 1-1/2 minutes

- Dogs over 12" at the withers that are not brachycephalic = approx. 600 yards in 2 minutes, The maximum time is not meant to be difficult to achieve, but to prevent a dog that "walks" the course from passing.

The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance. If there is a question as to which course a dog should run, the judge will decide.

CAN MY DOG EARN AN AKC TITLE FOR COURSING ABILITY?

Titles will be awarded for dogs that pass the Coursing Ability Test the required number of times.

- **Coursing Ability (CA)** – Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges.
- **Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA)** Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test ten times (CA + 7 additional passes)
- **Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX)** – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 25 times.
- **Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2)** –Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 50 times.
- **Higher numbered titles will be awarded for every additional twenty five passes.**

Eligibility to Participate

CAT is open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered/listed with the AKC. This includes dogs recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event. (An event number defines an event.)

An inspection committee shall inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete and females in season. If necessary, the inspection committee is responsible for measuring dogs to determine their height at the withers.

Safety

Safety is of utmost importance. It is the responsibility of the event committee to ensure the safety of the course, the equipment and the conduct of those involved with the event. It is recommended that the event committee run a test dog prior to the start of the event to ensure that the equipment functions properly and all personnel understand their jobs. Prior to moving the lure to position it for the start, the lure operator shall announce, “hold your dogs” to caution owners.

Lure Equipment: Clubs may use either a drag or continuous loop system. If a continuous loop system is used the “return” string must be set outside of the running course. The lure operator and the lure equipment shall be safely positioned in a manner that does not interfere with the retrieval of the dog at the end of the course.

Lure: A white plastic bag or a squawker may be used for the lure.

Course/Fencing: The course must be essentially flat. The club should consider fencing the course area; however, this is up to the decision of the club given the specifics of the setting. The premium should state if the location of the event is enclosed with fencing.

The Huntmaster Has Control of the Course

In summary, the Huntmaster oversees all dogs and handlers on the field, shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, shall ensure the lure is properly positioned, shall ensure the lure operator, and starting line signal person are ready, shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and shall give the verbal signal “tallyho” to release the dog.

Hosting CAT Events/Entering

All AKC clubs licensed for Lure Coursing or the Coursing Ability Test will be automatically licensed for Fast CAT. All other AKC member or licensed clubs may apply to the Performance Events Department (PerformanceEvents@akc.org) to become licensed to hold Fast CAT provided they have the experience, equipment, and location to hold a safe event. Clubs will be limited to twelve Fast CAT events per calendar year. A club may not hold more than two Fast CAT events on the same day. A test must start and conclude on the same day.

A CAT event can be either a stand-alone event or may be held in conjunction with other AKC events. In all cases the CAT must be applied for as a separate event with its own event number.

Entries: All participants must fill out an entry form as provided in the event’s premium list. A club may accept entries prior to the event and/or a club may accept day-of-event entries. The specifics of how entries will be accepted must be explained in the premium. A club may limit the number of entries it will accept in a CAT event. Additional “stand-by” entries above the limit may be taken at the discretion of the event committee, and these dogs will be allowed to run if time permits. Owners of stand-by dogs must be informed that they are on the stand-by list and may choose not to participate.

*****NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS*****

FACILITIES

Please ensure the comfort of you and your dogs by bringing your own portable shade, shelter and water.

Portable restrooms will be made available.

Feel free to bring your own food and drinks.

For the safety of the dog and as a courtesy to other entrants, a testing dog should have a reliable recall. A penalty of \$10.00 may be assessed for any dog causing an excessive delay of the event because it cannot be recalled or retrieved from the field. Dogs that delay the event because their owners cannot recall them may be refused entry at future events.

The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore they are in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, s/he has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog. Listen to the Huntmaster and follow all instructions promptly and swiftly.

Any decisions made by the event's officiating judge(s) regarding the performance of an entered dog shall be final. Full discretionary power is given to the judge(s) to withhold any and all qualifications for lack of merit. The Judge(s) is responsible for ensuring compliance with the AKC Regulations on the field.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and

exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.

Coursing Ability Test

Who should enroll in Canine Partners?

Dogs who wish to compete in the Coursing Ability Test must be either an AKC-registered dog or a part of the AKC Canine Partners program. Canine Partners is for mixed breeds or dogs who are otherwise ineligible for AKC registration.

Owners who enroll their dogs using the Coursing Ability Enrollment Form will receive the following Canine Partners benefits for their \$19.00 enrollment fee:

- Eligibility to participate in Agility, AKC Rally® and Obedience Events
- One year subscription to AKC Family Dog magazine
- Complimentary 60-day Trial AKC Pet Healthcare Plan *
- AKC Canine PartnersSM Program Official Certificate
- AKC Canine Partners decal

How should clubs enroll these dogs in Canine Partners?

1. Have the dog owners complete the Canine Partners Enrollment Application.
2. Collect payment. (*Payment for Canine Partners enrollment must be separate from event fees.*)
3. Assign the dog a Canine Partner's Enrollment Application Number (E1, E2, etc.) in box located in the upper right hand corner of the application. This number will be used to coordinate the results with the enrollment forms.
